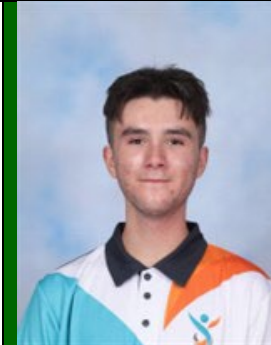

“At Wanganui we had a great student leadership culture and I want to bring some of those old, traditional values into our new leadership and school.

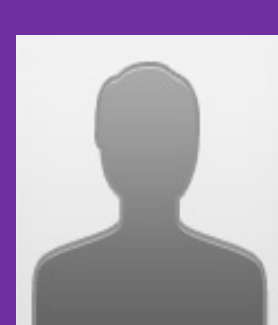
“I want to be a voice for those who can’t express themselves, or don’t want to and raise awareness of issues important to students.”
