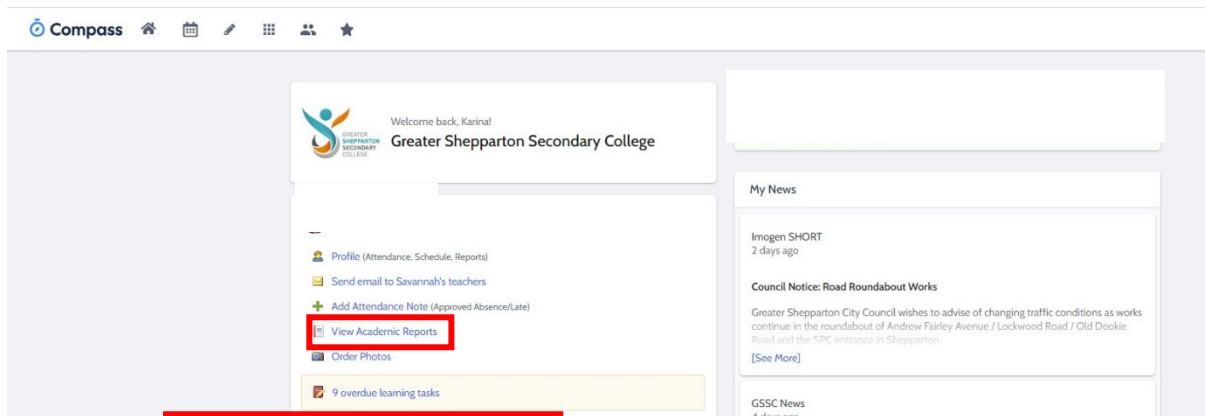


ACCESSING STUDENT PROGRESS (BAR) REPORTS

1. Log in to your Compass Parent Portal.



2. Select **View Academic results.**

3. Scroll down the page. The latest Progress (BAR) report shows by default.

4. To view a previous Progress Report, click on



5. Select the previous report you want from the pop-up window.

ACCESSING STUDENT REPORTS WITH THE COMPASS MOBILE APP

1. Open the mobile App
2. Click on “More” (Located at the bottom right-hand side of the screen)
3. Select option “Open in Browser” (This will direct you to a web page)
4. Click on “View Academic Reports” (Located under Child Name Profile)

ADVICE FOR PARENTS

Progress reports are one source of feedback about students' progress. However, the value of this information is strengthened when it is reflected upon and discussed with your child. Reflection can be tricky for students. You can assist by asking them questions. Your conversation should be focussed on success and how to keep improving.

Questions you may ask include:

- How do you feel about your BAR?
- What are you proud of in this BAR?
- Where do you think you might be able to make some improvements?
- What is it about this 'subject' that helps you to do well? How might you transfer or use this in another subject?
- If you could change one part of the report, what would it be?

It is also important that if your student seems to be unclear or uncertain about their interim report that you encourage them to speak directly to the classroom teacher for some additional feedback and support. This helps them to develop their personal accountability and strong interpersonal skills that will help them with future employment when they finish school.
